RE: City of Grand Island, NE - Specifications Division VI - Water Mains and Water Main Standard Plans

Division VI Specifications and Water Mains Standard Plans can be accessed from the City of Grand Island Utilities Department website, www.giud.com under Engineers & Contractors – Engineering Standards – Water Standards.

Below is a summary of the Division VI revisions:

31.06 Tapping Sleeves and Tapping Valves.

Updated tapping sleeve materials.

31.07 Water Main Valve Boxes.

Valve Boxes shall be 664SHD. Updated accepted products.

31.10 Fire Hydrants.

• Added Clow Valve Co. Medallion.

32.09.1 Hydrostatic Pressure Test.

• Solid sleeves are required to repair bell joint leaks on new construction.

32.10 Contractor's Expense for Testing.

• Updated chlorination charge to \$0.42 per linear feet of pipeline per City Fee Schedule.

32.11 Tapping of Water Mains.

• 48 hours advance notice for scheduling water main taps.

32.12 Separation from Sanitary Sewer / Storm Sewer Lines (Sewers) / Other Utility Lines and Structures.

• If concrete joint encasement is used for mitigation, all joints within ten (10) feet horizontally of either side of the water main must be encased.

32.12.2 Separation from Inlets.

Updated coating requirements and products.

32.20.2 Sterilization, Flushing and Sampling of Relocated Mains & Service Lines.

Updated chlorination charge to \$0.42 per linear feet of pipeline per City Fee Schedule.

36.01 General.

 Contractor required to submit a dewatering plan a minimum of 3 weeks prior to start of construction.
